**ORDER GRANTING TRUSTEE’S APPLICATION
TO EMPLOY RUBIN & LEVIN, P.C. AS COUNSEL TO THE
TRUSTEE EFFECTIVE *NUNC PRO TUNC* AS OF SEPTEMBER 16, 2016**

This matter is before the Court on the *Application to Employ Rubin & Levin, P.C. as Counsel to the Trustee Effective Nunc Pro Tunc as of September 16, 2016* (the “Application”) [Doc 13], filed by Deborah J. Caruso, the duly appointed, qualified and acting chapter 7 trustee in the above-referenced bankruptcy case (the “Trustee”). In the Application, the Trustee requests authority, pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 327(a) and Rule 2014(a) of the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure, to employ Rubin & Levin, P.C. (the “Firm”), as her counsel in this bankruptcy case, effective *nunc pro tunc* as of September 16, 2016.

The Court, having considered the *Declaration of Disinterestedness of John C. Hoard* and the Application, notes that members of the Firm represent no adverse interest to the debtor or the

debtor's bankruptcy estate and are disinterested persons in accordance with 11 U.S.C. § 327(a).

Accordingly, the Court determines that the Application should be, and hereby is, GRANTED. It is therefore,

ORDERED that the Application is approved. It is further,

ORDERED that, pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 327(a), the Trustee is authorized to employ the Firm as her counsel in this bankruptcy case, effective *nunc pro tunc* as of September 16, 2016, to act generally in all matters pertaining to the performance of her duties as the chapter 7 trustee.
