

ORDER GRANTING TRUSTEE’S MOTION FOR SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER REGARDING CERTAIN NURSING STUDENT TRANSCRIPTS

This matter came before the Court on the *Trustee’s Motion for Supplemental Order Regarding Certain Nursing Student Transcripts* (the “Motion”) [Doc 2568], filed by Deborah J. Caruso, the chapter 7 trustee in this case (the “Trustee”). In the Motion, the Trustee requests entry of a supplemental order to the Nursing Order,² pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 105, designating the graduation date as of March 7, 2018 for Graduated Nursing Students and directing that the degree obtained is an Associates of Science Degree in Nursing.

The Court, having considered the Motion and having convened a hearing on June 13, 2018, and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, determines that the Motion should be, and hereby is, GRANTED. Accordingly,

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:

1. The Motion is GRANTED in its entirety.
2. The terms, facts and reasoning of the Nursing Order [Doc 2449] are hereby incorporated by reference as if fully set forth herein and all relief granted herein is supplemental to said order.
3. All Graduated Nursing Students shall have a graduation date effective as of March 7, 2018.
4. The degree obtained by Graduated Nursing Students is an Associates of Science Degree in Nursing.
5. The Court shall retain jurisdiction to interpret, implement, and enforce the terms of this Order.
