**ORDER GRANTING TRUSTEE’S MOTION FOR AUTHORITY TO DESTROY CERTAIN DOCUMENTS REMOVED FROM THE DANIEL WEBSTER COLLEGE, INC. CAMPUS AND TO PAY THE COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE DESTRUCTION**

This matter came before the Court on the *Trustee’s Motion for Authority to Destroy Certain Documents Removed from the Daniel Webster College, Inc. Campus and to Pay the Costs Associated with the Destruction* (the “Motion”) [Doc 4479], filed by Deborah J. Caruso, the chapter 7 trustee in this case (the “Trustee”). In the Motion, the Trustee requests entry of an order, pursuant to 11 U.S.C. §§ 105 and 503, authorizing the Trustee to shred and destroy certain documents removed from the Daniel Webster College, Inc. (“DWC”) campus and to pay the costs associated with the shredding and destruction as an administrative expense.

The Court, having considered the Motion and having convened a hearing on October 13, 2021, and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, determines that the Motion should be, and hereby is, GRANTED. Accordingly,

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED as follows:

1. The Motion is GRANTED in its entirety.
2. The Trustee is authorized to retain and pay New England Security Shredders, LLC to shred and destroy the remaining Documents (as defined in the Motion) in an environmentally responsible manner and to dispose of the approximately 40 filing cabinets.
3. All costs associated with the shredding and destruction of the remaining Documents and the disposal of the approximately 40 filing cabinets shall be an administrative expense to be paid by the DWC estate.
