**ORDER SUSTAINING TRUSTEE’S OBJECTION TO  
CLAIM NO. 219, FILED BY GRANITE STATE STAMPS**

This matter is before the Court on the *Trustee’s Objection to Claim No. 219, filed by Granite State Stamps* (the “Objection”) [Doc 60], filed by Deborah J. Caruso, the chapter 7 trustee in this case (the “Trustee”). In the Objection, the Trustee requests that the Granite State Stamps Claim<sup>1</sup> be allowed in the amount of \$21.20 as a general unsecured claim because the Granite State Stamps Claim is not entitled to an administrative expense claim under 11 U.S.C. § 503(b)(9).

The Court, having considered the Objection and having convened a hearing on April 21, 2021, and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, determines that the Objection should be, and hereby is, SUSTAINED. Accordingly,

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED as follows:

1. The Objection is SUSTAINED.
2. The Granite State Stamps Claim is hereby allowed in the amount of \$21.20 as a general unsecured claim, and the administrative expense claim is disallowed in full.
3. The Trustee is hereby authorized to update the claims register accordingly.
4. The Court retains jurisdiction with respect to all matters arising from or related to the implementation of this Order.
