ORDER DENYING CLAIMANT’S SECOND MOTION TO RECONSIDER

On January 3, 2020, this Court entered an *Order Sustaining Tort Claimants Trustee’s Objection to Claim of Arthur Merriweather* [Docket No. 1869] (the “Order”). On January 6, 2020, Arthur Merriweather (the “Claimant”), filed a *pro se* motion¹ asking that the Court reconsider the Order, which the Court subsequently denied.² On February 13, 2020, the Claimant filed another *pro se* motion,³ which appears to ask that this Court once again reconsider its prior Order.

The Court has carefully reviewed the Second Motion to Reconsider. Largely for the reasons discussed in the Order Denying Claimant’s Motion to Reconsider, as well as for the reasons

enumerated in paragraph 22 of the *Tort Claimants Trustee's Objection to Arthur Merriweather's Motion to Reconsider* [Docket No. 1926], the Second Motion to Reconsider will be denied. While the Claimant filed a *pro se* response⁴ opposed to the Tort Claimants Trustee's claim objection,⁵ no one appeared on behalf of the Claimant at the hearing on December 16, 2019. The docket indicates that the hearing on the claim objection was properly noticed.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the Second Motion to Reconsider is **DENIED**.
